Dear School Owner:

The National Accrediting Commission of Career Arts & Sciences, Inc. (NACCAS) Board of Commissioners at its recent meeting held July 16, 2014, adopted two changes to NACCAS' *By-Laws*:

(1) to amend Article III to (i) reduce the number of Commissioners representing schools who are elected by zones to four (4) and increase the number of Commissioners representing schools who are elected "at large" to three (3); and (ii) provide that up to two (2) of the "at large" Commissioners representing schools, and one (1) of the Commissioners representing professional services, may be experienced administrators, rather than owners;

(2) to amend Article VII, Section IV.D of NACCAS' *By-Laws* (relating to the powers and duties of the Commission's Treasurer).

(The complete text of these *By-Laws* changes was included in the 2014 "Special *By-Laws* Call for Comment," circulated June 2014. A copy of the 2014 "Special *By-Laws* Call for Comment" can be viewed by [clicking here](#).)

The changes to Article VII of the NACCAS *By-Laws* became effective immediately. The changes to Article III of the NACCAS *By-Laws* shall become effective January 1, 2015; however, the Board of Commissioners has directed the Nominating Committee take these changes into consideration in the 2014 call for nominations and election processes so that the elections will reflect the composition of the 2015 Commission. *To view the complete changes to the By-Laws* [please click here](#).
